POSITION SUMMARY

The Community Volunteer Coordinator supports Washed Ashore's volunteer program that engages individuals in beach clean-ups, the creation of plastic waste sculpture art, and educational activities that illustrate the impact of plastic pollution in our oceans and waterways. The member will recruit, orient, and oversee volunteers supporting the organization, including the development of new ways to maximize the program to build the organization's capacity to provide educational opportunities to communities.

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES (to include, but not limited to)

- Engage with existing volunteer corps
- Recruit of new volunteers from the Bandon area and southern Oregon coast region
- Develop and execute a volunteer orientation manual and policy
- Plan and produce volunteer engagement, recruitment, and recognition events
- Develop an efficient system for tracking volunteer engagement and work accomplished
- Complete and submit all necessary UCAmeriCorps paperwork and reports in a timely manner.
- Attend and complete all UCAmeriCorps training and service requirements including orientation, training's, team meetings and national service days.
- Wear AmeriCorps apparel and/or appropriate identifiers while performing service or attending official events.

- Possession of a high school diploma or equivalent, or commit to earning one prior to receiving an education award.
- Ability to commit to the full term of service for which they are applying.
- Must successfully pass a fingerprint criminal history background check provided through UCAN and/or Project Host Site.
- Regular and reliable attendance.
- Have not previously served four terms in an AmeriCorps*State or National program. Members are only eligible for the equivalent of two full-time education awards in their lifetime. Applicants must disclose if they have ever been removed for cause from any national service program.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Some college study in environmental education and/or the arts
- Knowledge of software programs such as Airtable and WordPress

Office environment and volunteer workshop area with some use of tools and power tools

Some work on building and crafting small panels, use of power tools, some lifting

Washed Ashore has two facilities that are eight miles apart so some travel between the venues is important

MEMBER BENEFITS INCLUDE

- \$7,490 living allowance paid over the 6-month service term (approx. \$1,248 monthly, before taxes).
- \$2,960 education award upon successful completion of the term of service which can be used to repay qualified student loans or for further education in an accredited institution of higher learning, vocational or trade schools. The education award is taxed in the year that it is used. Members that are 55 and older may transfer the award to one child or grandchild.
- May be eligible for Loan Forbearance & Interest Accrual Repayment on qualified loans (after successful completion of a term of service, AmeriCorps will pay the accrued interest on qualified loans, which is taxable).
- Basic medical insurance (covers members only, not dependents; vision and dental not included).
- Child care allowance for those who qualify.
- Professional development, trainings and networking opportunities

STEP 2: Apply to Project Site Mentor:

Conducts first round interviews on a rolling basis and recommends top candidates to UCA Email the following items to john@artula.org:

- Resume
- Cover Letter (1 page)
- Contact information for three Reference (name, title, relationship, email, & phone)

STEP 3: The Project Site Mentor submits top applicants to UCA for a second interview. Once top applicant interviews are complete, applicants will be notified of selection decision.
